#### President's Message

When I start to write a President's Message, I usually go to the same month of the previous year and look at what I was interested in at that time. Today, I looked at my July message from 2021 to refresh my memory and found I wrote about point of view. As I mentioned in that message, the topic came from my *From Plot to Print* class where we'd just discussed POV.

Today, I want to talk about branding. I've spoken quite a bit about branding in the past, but I realized recently that not everyone knows what I mean when I say branding. And even more than that, not everyone agrees on how important it is.

If you consider that there are between six-hundred thousand and one million books published each year, it can feel like your book is one grain of sand on the beach. How do you make it stand out and be noticed in such a dense field of competition?

#### Branding.

I'm always surprised at the pushback I get from fellow authors when I mention this. I've heard the following statements so many times that I can almost mouth them the moment I mention the B-word: people should want to read my book because I write very well. The plot and the writing are the most important part, and I'm not interested in being commercial.

I get it. And fundamentally, these authors are absolutely right. No one wants to read a poorly written or boring book, but how in the world do you think your readers are going to know how well you write unless they remember you?

Is it possible for you to be organically discovered by readers? Absolutely.

Is it possible for them to be so smitten with your work that they'll always remember you and search you out? Definitely.

Is it possible that they'll enjoy your book, then promptly forget who you are because there are so many books waiting on their nightstand or in their Kindle for them to read? I'm afraid so.

How do you make sure your readers are going to remember you once they close your book? I'm sure you know my answer: branding.

Some misconceptions about branding and my answer are as follows:

- I have a series, but each of the books is about different characters. I can't brand myself around different characters.
  - You can and should. Pick something in the book that is the same across the series.
    - Setting is a perfect idea. Is it set in a big city? Can you use some iconic images from the city to place on the cover?
    - Can you brand around a color? If it's a police procedural, for example, could every cover be a shade of blue?
    - Can you brand around an image? Every character is named after a flower.
    - Can you brand around a font?

See, the possibilities are endless.

- I don't want my books to look the same.
  - Why not? What is wrong with having continuity so someone can recognize the series when they see it?
    - This can be as simple as every book has a silhouette on it. Or, there is a red band over the author's name.
- I don't have time to worry about this. I've got to get the book out.
  - Why would this ever be the problem? You've spent all this time creating your baby. Why would you send it out into the world without clothes?
- I'm not visual that way.
  - No problem. There are people who are.

- And if you can't afford those people, do your research. Look at other books. Don't get caught up on one element of that author's branding.
  - Look for images, but also look for symbols, fonts, design elements (maybe every book has a scroll on it).
  - Colors, black-and-white photos, or splashes of random color can be branding.
- I've already paid for the covers and I don't want to change them. I like what I've got.
  - This one is really hard and I don't mean to offend anyone, but you need to ask yourself a difficult question, and you need to be honest. Are you selling books? When was your last sale? How hard did you have to work to achieve that sale? Did you have to "hand" sell the book or was it bought online?
    - If your last few sales have all been "hand" sells, if you haven't had a sale online in weeks or months, you have a branding problem. There are inexpensive ways to change your cover.
    - Should you change your cover? Well, if you realize that nothing is happening toward putting your book in readers' hands, except when you directly have to talk it up to them, you should definitely re-evaluate.
    - And while you may like the cover, are you getting caught up in a sentimental reason that the reader doesn't know or care about? In brutal honesty, no one cares if you like the cover. Does it pop for the reader?

Again, I'm not speaking to anyone specifically. And more than anything, I don't want to offend. I'll be honest, the books I've read by "traditionally" published authors lately have left me feeling bored and disappointed. Some really great writing is coming from indies, but in order to swim in an ocean full of sharks, the minnow has got to be faster, sleeker and flashier. (Yes, I know minnows are fresh water.)



- Learn from experts, but remember that even expert advice is not always perfect for you.
- If you add another pet, especially adult versus adult, expect a challenge and many baby steps! It is doable but such changes are stressful to the pets! I recommend Jackson Galaxy YouTubes.
- Ferals and strays aren't tough superhero tough. They, like us, need food, water, and a safe shelter. Despite conflicting opinions, most outdoor cats, especially strays, don't survive well, or at all, without human help. Helping in a shelter is a quick way to learn this.
- It is against the law to harm or relocate them. It's easy to Google rescues and ways to help. And for those who don't like cats, well, repellent is affordable. If nothing else, leave them alone and request help from shelters or rescues if an animal looks sick or injured. It doesn't hurt to post a pic on public media and share info about the animal.


