This past weekend, I took my youngest son to the Monterey Bay Aquarium. Yesterday was his twenty-sixth birthday, and that is what he chose to do. He's been wanting to go for a few years now, but Covid sort of derailed our previous plans.

Two of my sons are vision impaired due to a genetic mutation, so taking him was a priority for me while he still has remaining sight. We had a wonderful time and while we were in the wave exhibit, I took a picture of him, staring up in amazement. It's a picture I will cherish for the remainder of my life.

Many of you know about the struggles my two sons have had, because I've talked about it before, but I haven't written about it. In fact, this may be the first time. It's been hard for me as a mother (I know it isn't anything as hard as what my sons are going through), but I worry about what will happen if I'm not here to help them or how they will manage in life as their vision worsens. I follow all the latest research with a strange desperation, and while I believe there will eventually be a cure, the other fear that there might not be crowds my mind. In fact, this constant worry has kept me up more nights than I can tell you.

However, life is a constant surprise, and humans are resilient. Both of my sons are adapting far better than I have, but even for me, I'm learning to live with the realization that this is our reality. As my youngest son has told me over and over again – it's not a death sentence, it just makes things more challenging.

Since Covid, my family has felt like it's been in a weird stasis where so much of our time has been dominated by our adjusting to their vision loss, but this past year has seen a flurry of wonderful events for us that I didn't expect to happen.

My middle son got married, had a baby daughter, and bought his first house. In Idaho, but I'm choosing to ignore that. I'm forcing myself to look on the bright side, knowing that he's only an hour's plane ride away. My oldest son is getting engaged and has also bought his first home. And my youngest has a new love interest. He is happier than I've seen him in years, and this makes me so very happy for him. Knowing that all three boys have healthy, happy relationships takes away some of the worry. They have someone in their corner, even when I can't be there.

My point is this: you never know what might happen in life. Even when things seem like they are the most bleak, the most difficult, there is always the possibility of change. Never give up hope.

And as our two guest journalists for May will tell you, there's always a chance for something amazing to enter your life when you least expect it.

DOWN THAT GOOGLE RABBIT HOLE AGAIN! This time with corn




