In addition, Michelle just started back to work (HS teacher) the beginning of Aug, and is still trying to find time to write books at her normal pace.

So – instead, since I was there most of the time helping out (along with Danita, our NCPA secretary), I'll touch bases on the Fair as well as give a quick rundown of our first face-to-face meeting this month, 13 Aug 4pm-6:30pm, at our new location: Flaming Grill in the old CCP shopping Mall at Watt Av & El Camino Av.

**NCPA August meeting recap:** I did something new this time, and asked for an RSVP, whether coming or not, or even just a maybe. It worked really well, and I greatly appreciate those who not only sent a YES, but as requested, several marked NO, and even a couple marked MAYBE. The only thing that wasn't quite 100% helpful, was the amount of Email generated by that request --- LOL --- 68 messages went back and forth, b/c I responded to each. BUT, it worked so well, barring the extra time for me, I'm going to continue doing it, and I hope we continue to get the amount of response – or even more – in upcoming months. I have a system now ..... Maybe .....

The Flaming Grill is a great place for our meetings – the service was good, especially since there was only one waiter (but I had told them not to add any extra help, b/c we weren't going to be in any hurry, and nobody would complain if they got a bit backlogged). Surprisingly, he was better than the service we've had elsewhere – except Black Angus. They've always been great; we'll be back at Black Angus 10 Dec 12Noon-?? for our Holiday Luncheon.

For any of you looking for a place to book for another writing organization or other event, Flaming Grill doesn't charge for the quiet, private room (holds 40), we got separate checks, parking is plentiful, the food's good and decent-priced. BTW, I had the Gator-Bite Po Boy served on a toasted Dutch Crunch Roll, and it was GREAT. I asked for it dry, b/c I didn't want anything to distract from the flavor of the alligator (which I've not only eaten before, but have cooked several times). I'll probably have it again at the **Sep meeting – Sun 10 Sep 4pm-6:30pm.** 

Our Aug meeting had no guest speaker, instead we just introduced ourselves and visited – gained one new member, a few only had something to drink, a couple also took to-go-orders, and many oohed and aahed over Sharon's new 2-month-old puppy, Great Dane "Freddie" Melina Mercury, who she had there in a shopping cart.

**FAIR Authors Booth Booksellers – past, current, and future:** Just a reminder for next year; we authors are very fortunate to only be required to pay 15% for our daily sales in order to even be there selling our books -- and we pay nothing if we don't sell anything. That doesn't happen if you have to pay for your own space.

FYI - That space, in the prime position it's in – inside an airconditioned building at that (although this year, there were a couple of days during the peak of record temps, 3 of the 4 air conditioners in the building temporarily stopped working), and so close to the most popular booth at the fair (the Cinnamon Rolls) – would run in the high hundreds to thousands of dollars for one or two individual booths if we didn't have it locked in, bringing in a collective amount at least close to the going amount for booth space.

The Fair's Authors Booth isn't tied to NCPA (except for the fortunate fact for NCPA, that Michelle happens to be head honcho for each), so there's no reason to be specific here, on the amounts generated. I'll only say that Michelle was happy that we generated more than she expected, what with the extreme heat, plus decreased amount of fair-goers. My guess is the sales were partially due to a few new authors (to the Authors Booth) with a new batch of books (especially for kids and YA), and previous authors with new books, plus loyal fans of particular authors with a bunch of books, including both older and new (Michelle for one! She has oodles of books, and VERY loyal fans – I believe more than one of those fans walked out with an armful of books that she didn't already have, and specifically waits for the fair to purchase more, in person: full series ... actually multiple series ... 10-15 books, at least, once).

Speaking of those new sellers this year, the ones who sold the most, were the YA authors – and YA was also the most genre asked about - lending to the thought that because we don't have many in that genre, we need more YA authors for next year. So, if you're a published YA author living anywhere in California, and would like to participate at the Authors Booth at the CA State Fair next year, please contact Michelle after 1 January 2024 for submission and acceptance procedure information. (The fair normally runs from the middle of July to the end of July – 17 days total. Each author generally is physically there 2 -- 4 days, but can leave your books for Danita to sell the other days. All of that info will be explained by Michelle once you've submitted).

You can respond to this Email if you don't have Michelle's info, and have questions. I'll forward to her.

# Fun Piece from NCPA member <u>Elaine FABER</u> – <u>Thank you Elaine</u> How to Write a Best-Selling Mystery Novel

#### The Hook

Chapter one has a hook that keeps the reader turning pages. She must connect with the main character enough to continue this journey past page ten. The plot should be original, compelling, and not a carbon copy of other cozy mystery novels.

#### Conflict

Some conflict occurs quickly, that prevents the main character from easily fulfilling his goal until page 265. Perhaps it's a CIA agent bringing a killer to justice, or a turbulent romance with the boy next door, or an interplanetary sixheaded monster. If the CIA agent catches the villain on page twenty-one, why continue reading? If the girl receives an engagement ring on page six, where is the conflicted romance? If the monster is vanquished by Round-Up weed killer on page forty-nine, the book becomes a paper-weight.

#### **Supporting Characters**

Besides the intriguing main characters, a good story has convincing, entertaining supporting characters. They are the friends, relatives, or even the protagonist's pet–someone or something to interact and react with the main character. They may provide the conflict or be the catalyst of the plot, as when Agnes sees old Dr. Schatzsman burglarizing neighborhood homes in my latest **Mrs. Odboddy's Desperate Doings.** 

#### **Beginning-Middle-End**

A good book has an exciting beginning, an interesting middle, and a satisfying end. The beginning of the story jumps into an event that intrigues the reader. A specific conflict and goal must be revealed within the first few pages to keep the reader turning pages.

The middle deals with the conflict, where the character struggles to overcome the obstacles, but events go from bad to worse, and when all seems lost, we come to the exciting conclusion. The reader leaves the dog in the bathtub or cookies in the oven to see what happens next.

The ending ties up the loose strings, solves all the puzzles and reaches a conclusion that is acceptable to the reader. Did you ever read a 300-page novel and the main character dies on the last page? You want to heave the book against the wall!

#### The Satisfying Conclusion

In a satisfying conclusion, the antagonist is revealed and brought low, the hero gets the girl, or the interplanetary six-headed monster is relieved of at least two of his six heads. The conclusion leaves the reader satisfied and, hopefully, looking for the sequel.

#### The Right Editor

A best seller needs a good editor and mentors to correct spelling or punctuation errors, poorly written sentences, or scenes that are less than compelling. She provides corrections in a constructive manner that helps the author complete an exciting novel.

#### The Book Cover

The book cover is snappy, good-looking, and brightly colored with an easily read title. The cover should convey at least the general theme or storyline. An appealing cover tempts the potential buyer to flip over the book and read the back cover blurb, and the blurb secures the book's sale.

Now I've told you how you write a best seller. The next step is to promote, market, and sell your 'best seller.

#### **RAE'S SUMMER READING PROGRAM**

We are in the midst of summer here in the Sacramento Valley and the weather has finally turned hot. School is still weeks from starting and a lot of parents are looking for things to help keep their kids occupied for the remaining few weeks before the school bell starts ringing again.

While getting the time to take a break from learning is important, it is equally as important to for children to continue to read during the time off. Over the summer months, kids can lose valuable skills and knowledge. Studies show participating in a summer reading program increases reading skills, motivation, confidence, and enjoyment.

The latest *Scholastic Kids Reading and Family Report* indicated 61% of kids surveyed say they love reading in the summer and a whopping 93% of kids are happier when they read books they pick out themselves! But here is the disturbing factor: 96% of parents surveyed know summer reading is important but they don't know why.

#### Here is the why:

- 1. Studies show students lose up to two months of reading skills and 2.5 months of math skills over the summer. By the time a student has reached middle school they have lost two years of learning.
- Teachers need to take two to four weeks at the beginning of the school year to reteach what students have lost. This impacts our educational system, costing somewhere in the neighborhood of \$1500 per student for the time it takes to reteach what is lost.
- 3. Students are still playing "catch up" from losing skills during the pandemic, making summer reading equally as important.

I can continue to spout off statistics, but I think at this point, it's more important for us to take action.

#### What can we do?

- Find a local summer reading program. Many area libraries, local bookstores, and Little Free Libraries offer free summer reading programs. AND the best part is they can help your child pick books that interest them.
- Check with your local kids' clubs, community recreational districts, or Boys and Girls Clubs.
- Does your child have a special interest such as sports, horses, scouts, science or art? Many of these clubs have free summer reading programs.
- Email your school or child's teacher. Before classes get out for summer, email your child's teacher and ask if they can send books home over the summer OR provide you a reading list with suggested titles.
- Google. There are many online resources for free summer reading programs.

#### What can we do at home?

- Read with your child.
- Ask them questions about what they are reading.
- Encourage them to choose books about topics they like.
- Read a recipe.

Children average 4,000 to 12,000 words a year through reading – if your child averages 8000 words a year, they gain 1335 words over the summer.

Thank you, Rae, and my suggestions would be to not stop when summer is over – instead, continue on throughout the year, especially during the long holidays of Thanksgiving, Christmas, spring break, etc. (and apologies if this isn't p.c., or if I've unknowingly not included other holidays. I no longer have kids in school and don't know when they're in or out of school any more. Things have changed a bunch since I last had to deal with this).

I might also suggest, instead of just reading a recipe, actually have the kids follow recipes and help make something. Cookies and candies are always great things for kids to help with. Here's a really quick and easy candy recipe that works great for all the holidays and everyone enjoys. It's my own recipe that has won the blue first place ribbon at both the Sacramento County Fair & the California State Fair each time I've entered, plus Best of Something at both Fairs, the first year I made it, but I can't remember which" Best" (just NOT best of show, that I'm sure of).

#### Nonie's Special Peanut Butter-BUTTERFINGER Rocky Road

- > 1 small pkg Mini-Marshmallows
- ▶ 18 oz pkg BUTTERFINGER BITS (found in the chocolate chip section at Walmart)
  - > (1 small jar peanuts if desired optional I used them once, prefer without)

Lightly mix in large bowl and set aside

Butter a large (9"x13") rectangular Pyrex (or similar) baking dish. Cover every inch, especially the corners. Set aside

- ➤ 18oz pkg Milk Chocolate Chips (Dark Choc ok I prefer Milk Choc)
- > 1 to 2 C Peanut Butter (Amount, to taste) (Crunchy or Smooth, either is fine)
  - ➤ ½ cube of Margarine or butter, either works
- > 1 small can Eagle Brand Sweetened Condensed Milk (DO NOT USE ANY OTHER BRAND)

> 1 t Vanilla

Add chips, peanut butter, margarine, milk, and vanilla in medium-size pan and heat on LOW until chips melt. Stir almost constantly to prevent burning or scorching. If it does burn or scorch, toss and start over. As soon as chips melt, pour the WARM mixture over bowl of marshmallow mix. Stir gently to blend well, dump into buttered Pyrex and cool in fridge. When firm cut into desired squares – OR - drop by spoonsful on wax paper-covered cookie sheet to make individual pieces.

Space candy about ½" apart if dropping onto cookie sheet. Cut into 1" to 2" squares if using Pyrex bowl – can also use both!

\*Dan Poynter: American author, consultant, <u>publisher</u>, professional speaker and <u>parachute</u> designer, **Poynter** (17 Sep 1938 – 3 Nov 2015), starting in 1969, wrote more than 130 books, many reports, and more than 800 magazine articles, most of them on book <u>publishing</u>. The writing and publishing of *The Self-Publishing Manual* in 1979 propelled him to notoriety in the publishing industry. Each year he addressed scores of groups on the subject of publishing. \*\*\* NCPA was one of those groups, where he was an instructor at one of our final conferences around 2009 or 2010.
