#### President's Message

On September 23rd, I had the honor of meeting with attendees at the Elk Grove Guild Writers Conference. According to everyone who attended, it was a very successful event, and for my part, I enjoyed getting to talk to a number of people during our one-on-one sessions.

Two things came up over and over again when I met with my fellow writers: one, how to prioritize projects; and two, how to market their books so they can be found by readers. I started each session by asking the writers to tell me about themselves and their writing experiences, which was truly fascinating in every single case. We all come to the act of writing for so many different reasons, but the main thread is a desire to impart information or to share our stories, even if that story is telling about someone else's life.

After hearing their path to writing, I asked them what their publication goal was. I ask this question a lot when I work with writers, and I always preface it by saying any goal is a worthy goal. In fact, there is no wrong goal, no wrong answer to this. Imparting knowledge – excellent goal. Chronicling the lives of our ancestors – fantastic goal. Even earning money is a worthy goal, and one too often, I feel, writers are ashamed to admit.

But why? We don't ask doctors to exclude income from their desire to become a doctor. We definitely don't tell lawyers they shouldn't want to get paid. Why should writers, or artists, or musicians be any different? Because one has a passion for something, and because that passion brings pleasure to others, doesn't mean the creator shouldn't be compensated for it.

If you are struggling to prioritize your projects, ask yourself that question. What is my goal? Why do I want to do each of the things I want to do? If you do this, you might just find that you already know where your focus should be.

I'm a victim of this myself. I think up a story and I want to write it immediately, but then I reach the sticky middle or it doesn't flow as easily as I want, and another bright shining project draws my attention. I've learned to focus on only one project at a time until I complete it. Setting minor goals for yourself can help with this. I tell myself I need to be through chapter two by a certain date, then when I accomplish that, I set a new milestone.

The second frequent question I heard was how to get people to find and actually read your book. This one is so much harder. There are so many books out there and only so many readers, but finding your niche is essential. There's no one, single way to do this, but two things that I know stop readers from picking up a book – a poorly designed cover, and an unimaginative back cover copy.

I know that we're told never to judge a book by its cover, but we all know that's exactly what we do. I've never walked into a bookstore and been drawn to the most drab or busy cover there. I'm drawn to bright colors, bold text, and intriguing images.

Probably more important is the back cover copy. As I told people on Saturday, it needs to be a little sexy, a little titillating. It should definitely not read like a high school essay. Dear God, let me tell you, that is not appealing at all and I know. I am mired in "I'm going to tell you about..." "my essay will prove..." for ten months out of every year.

If you took the query you wrote to the umpteenth agent and used it for your back cover copy, you have a problem. The best way to solve this one is to read the back covers of books in your genre to see how they attract readers. If that doesn't work, I recommend working with an editor to hone your skills on this.

I'm not promising that making these two changes will make your book an instant best seller, but at least they will position it better in the market and help you stand out from the crowd. And knowing what your goal is, whatever it is, can help you reprioritize your purpose for undertaking this often-difficult artistic endeavor.

### Words from the Author .... Carolyn Radmanovich

My love for writing has always found expression in short stories and poetry, but the turning point in my literary journey unfolded nearly three decades ago during a spring excursion with my husband on the scenic Russian River in Healdsburg, California.

As we navigated the river's gentle flow, we encountered a dramatic twist in our adventure—an immense tree had toppled into the water, forming a formidable obstacle. With all our might, we paddled furiously, determined to overcome this unexpected challenge, yet destiny had other plans, and we collided with the tree.

The canoe capsized, plunging me beneath the vessel, trapped beneath the tree's gnarled branches, my lungs aching for air. Desperately, I strained against the canoe, but to no avail. The dreadful realization that I was trapped and facing an impending watery grave overwhelmed me.

In hindsight, I reflected on my life filled with cherished moments, yet shorter than I had hoped. With the specter of death closing in, a profound acceptance washed over me. A strange sense of joy arose as I embraced the impending transition into the boundless spiritual realm and a grand adventure. With this profound serenity, I inhaled what I thought would be my last breath, and the world faded to black

After searching the river, my husband attempted to dislodge the stubbornly trapped canoe, but the relentless suction of the powerful current held it captive. Finally, after beginning to panic, a surge of adrenalin coursed through his veins, and he gave a mighty push, breaking the canoe free. With that monumental effort, I surfaced.

My feet scraping against the riverbed's coarse gravel jolted me awake. I automatically stood, and the chilly water went up to my neck. Panic set in as I struggled to breathe, my throat constricting, and all that escaped were choking sounds. My husband stood many feet away and urged me to relax and attempt to breathe. After several agonizing attempts, I could draw air into my lungs. Once I reached the bank, I twirled in circles, saying over and over, "I'm alive."

It was only later that I came to understand I had experienced a phenomenon known as "dry drowning." Sometimes, the airway is triggered when cold water starts to enter the throat, rendering a person unable to breathe and potentially leading to a fatal outcome.

About an hour before the incident, we had enjoyed a leisurely picnic on a gravel bar. We caught sight of a magnificent, dark, three-story house adorned with elegant turrets. I would have loved to walk there, but the vegetation was too thick.

In the following weeks, I was haunted by dreams and visions of that house, which filled my waking thoughts with an irresistible urge to return. My husband and I embarked on a quest to rediscover it, driving the charming river road in Healdsburg. Disappointed we didn't find the house; we contacted the local fire station for assistance.

A compassionate firefighter revealed she knew the house's location and kindly provided me with the owner's phone number. When I called, I told the woman my story. In a generous gesture, she gave me directions to a gate that would swing open automatically. The dirt road wound its way through picturesque vineyards.

Upon our arrival at the mysterious, turreted house, the owner was waiting in her weathered pickup. She beckoned us into the truck and drove us to where she thought we had picnicked at the gravel bar. When she let us out, she told us to take all the pictures we wanted and then return to the house.

After I took numerous photos, we walked up the vineyard-covered hillside to the home at the top of the hill. I knocked, and the owner invited me in. Not wanting to impose, I declined but did take a furtive peek inside, fueled by my curiosity. I shared with her my sense of indebtedness to God and the universe for allowing me to survive, which in turn made me desire to want to write a book. The owner expressed interest in receiving a copy when it was completed, and I readily agreed. When I turned toward our car, my husband reminded me of a detail I had previously mentioned from my dreams—an image of a dark pool behind the house. Some years later, I called the owner and invited her to dinner. To my delight, she welcomed me into her home. As I stepped inside, a wave of astonishment washed over me. The interior of the house had a striking

resemblance to the setting I had described in my book. We connected immediately with a shared understanding of the world of shamans and shape-shifting running through our conversation. She confided in me that she and her husband had recently journeyed to Peru, where they had the privilege of encountering a shaman. This connection deepened our bond, bridging the realms of fiction and reality in a remarkable way.

Upon finishing my initial novel, *The Shape-Shifter's Wife*, predominantly centered around the character Angelica, I felt there was more to write about the two sisters, so I completed *The Gypsy's Warning*, which is about Heather, the second sister. Another story I called *The Mummy's Gift* demanded to be told, a piece of the saga. It revolves around the two sisters' relentless quest to find each other, pushing the story into an intricate web of connection and intrigue. While I currently view the series as concluded, I remain open to the possibility of another novel should the characters continue to call out to me in the realm of my imagination.

For future projects, I'm eager to publish a book of poetry chosen from my collection of over 300 poems I've penned throughout my lifetime. I also drafted a manuscript centered on Bacchus, the exuberant deity of wine and revelry, who comes alive in this modern era and whose pleasure-seeking ways are refocused when he falls maddeningly in love for the first time.

My husband has encouraged me to write a book that delves into my spiritual life and profound meditational experiences. For example, when visiting China for my son's wedding, he took us to the White Cloud Taoist Temple. When I arrived, a profound sense of *Déjà vu* washed over me, giving me the conviction that I had walked these sacred grounds in a distant lifetime. Guided by a sense of knowing, I requested my family to follow me as I led them on an impromptu tour, confident in my connection to the temple and Taoism.

This remarkable experience is one of many in the tapestry of my spiritual journey, interwoven by numerous mystical encounters and profound revelations. These narratives will find a place in the pages of the book I'm creating.
