The Sacramento County Fair has similar, in May, but I've not received anything from them on that yet, so probably won't do it this year, either --- my angel food cake wins top prize every year entered, at both Fairs.

Both Fairs also have Art and Photo competitions for ribbons and money prizes – I've also won both for my noniedoodles at the County Fair, but haven't entered those in the State Fair (the rules are too complicated) – that State Fair link should be coming soon. NCPA BOD member Chrissi Villa also enters this one, and has won several times, both ribbons and \$\$.

The State Fair is like homecoming to me – I worked there as a cashier from 1963-1984 ... 17 days straight from open (9 or 10am) to close (10 or 11pm) every day for those 17 days, with only one short 30-minutes out of the booth for combined lunch/ dinner break each of those days. That was when the Fair started in the middle of Aug and ended 17 days later, on the celebrated Labor Day Mon every year. Sharon & I wish they'd go back to being open during those months ... we kinda miss it! Norma Jean
