President's Message * 24 Jun 2021

Yesterday in *my writing class, *From Plot to Print*, the issue came up about what point of view a writer should write in. Generally, that decision has to be made by the author and should be whatever feels best for that particular story; however, how do you know if you've chosen the right **POV?

First, let's identify the types of POV and why you might choose to write in each one. There are a lot of very good videos on YouTube outlining this, but I'm going to try to put it into a simplified guide for reference.

There are three main POVs:

- First Person
- Second Person
- Third Person

I'm going to give a brief overview of each one and explain why an author might choose it, giving you some pros and cons for each.

First Person:

In this POV, the author is writing from the perspective of a character as if the author was that person. Many modern novels are written in first person. Think *The Hunger Games*, *The Handmaid's Tale*, or *Gone Girl*.

The advantage of writing in first person is to put the reader directly into the story. The reader identifies strongly with the character and feels as if he or she is experiencing the events in the story firsthand.

The disadvantage of writing in first person is how limiting it can be. Often you only get the perspective of the narrator and if the narrator is unreliable (think Holden Caulfield in *Catcher in the Rye*), the reader doesn't know if the narrator is telling the truth or not.

Second Person:

Very few novels are written in second person. Think of the *choose your own adventure* novels from your youth. Second person POV utilizes *you* and *your*. The idea behind it is to make the reader feel as if he or she is in the story. The reader becomes the character.

The advantages of writing in second person are that the reader can experience what the character experiences, and it's such a unique writing style, you'd have little competition with other authors in marketing your books.

The disadvantages are consistency and redundancy. The constant use of *you say*, *you are*, *you go* can pull the reader from the flow of your story. It can also make the story feel like a poor attempt to bring a video game to the written page.

Third Person:

Before we can discuss the pros and cons of third person, we need to establish that third person has two types of formats. There is third person *omniscient* and third person *limited*. Let's talk about third person omniscient first of all.

Third person omniscient is literally the god perspective. It is a much older form of third person narration in which the narrator knows what every single character is thinking and doing at all times. Books like *Jurassic Park*, *The Lord of the Rings*, and *A Time to Kill* are written in third person omniscient.

The advantage to this writing POV is the ability to give the thoughts of all the characters. The reader gets a complete picture of the events and the motivations of each character. It's particularly effective if the focus of the novel is on the characters' relationships with each other.

The disadvantage of this writing style is the distance it creates between the reader and the characters. Since the reader knows what all of the characters are thinking, they don't develop a connection to any one character.

The second type of third person POV is limited. Like first person, third person limited allows the reader to connect with one character and know his or her thoughts, but unlike first person, the reader isn't limited to just that character's experiences.

The pros are it allows more freedom to show events from different characters' POV, and it allows the reader to know information that the first-person narrator might not know.

The con is that it does set up some distance between the reader and the character, because the reader may have information that the character doesn't have. In first person narration, the reader only learns information when the character discovers it.

The most important thing to decide with POV is which one moves the story along the best. If you want a cinematic approach, third person omniscient might be the right choice. If you want a first-person shooter approach, you might try second person. If you begin writing your book in one POV and it just doesn't seem to flow, try writing a passage in another POV and see if that fixes the problem.

But whatever point of view you choose, just make sure you are consistent. Nothing will turn off a reader quicker than realizing the author doesn't have control over his or her narration.






