President's Message

Last month, I wrote about the different points of view and the pros and cons for writing in each. This month I want to tackle narrative tenses, and the pros and cons for each of these.

Before we begin, what do I mean by narrative tense? Well, in simple terms, it is the verb tense you use to write your story. Depending on who you ask, there are either three or four narrative tenses. The most popular are: past simple, past continuous, and past perfect continuous. According to the BBC, there is also a past perfect without the continuous. Not to muddy the waters (or the pond -- get it--across the pond?), but I'm American, so I'm gonna talk about three.

Past Simple:

This tense is used for actions in the past.

Example: Nigel felt that the American disregard for the past perfect tense was uncivilized.

Past Continuous:

This tense is used for action that has happened in the past and has continued to happen for a long time. It can also be used for two actions happening at the same time.

Example: Nigel was beginning to believe that the Americans didn't speak the same language as he did, while Ester was beginning to suspect that Nigel had overstayed his welcome.

Past Perfect Continuous:

This tense is used for action that started in the past and continued until another point in the past. Yeah, I know. *What?* Basically, the action has stopped, but it continued for a set amount of time.

Example: Nigel had been feeling that his superior knowledge of grammatical tenses put him at odds with his American friends, while Ester had been feeling that he was a pretentious idiot.

Basically, if you want *past tense*, you put the sentence into active voice and eliminate the helping verbs. If you want *past continuous*, you add a helping verb in the form of a verb of *being* (is, are, was, were, be, being, been) and an -ing on the main verb. If you want *past perfect continuous*, you bring in the *had* helping verbs and a verb of *being* with an -ing on the main verb. Easy-peasy, lemon squeezy, right?

Wrong. A lot of modern literature is now written in present tense. Why? Well, it gives immediacy to the writing. Writing in present tense makes the reader feel like they are *there* with the main character, experiencing everything at the same time.

Present Tense:

This tense is used to describe current events or states of being.

Example: Nigel wonders why Americans try to simplify a language that is beautiful because of its nonsense rules and contradictions, but then he decides that perhaps Americans are so diverse, they must have a common method to express themselves.

So, what are the pros and cons for past versus present tenses?

Pros for Past Tense:

Most books are written in past tense and readers understand this type of writing best. It's easy for the reader to get into the flow of your narration. You can also disclose things to the reader that the main character doesn't know.

Cons for Past Tense:

It sets up a situation where the urgency may be blunted. Most readers understand that the stakes for the main character are not lethal because the main character is in a story that already took place in a time before the present.

Pros for the Present Tense:

Readers experience exactly what the main character experiences. The reader may feel like the consequences for the main character are more imminent because neither the reader nor the character knows what happens at the end.

Cons for Present Tense:

It's hard to write in this tense. In other words, it isn't a natural way to write. You have to be careful to make sure you don't automatically slip into past tense. Writing in present tense also eliminates the ability to clue your reader into something that the character doesn't know.

The most important thing to remember is this: whichever tense you use, stay consistent. Do not jump through time. Nothing will mark you as an amateur in your writing more than switching your tense. Make sure you're always in control of your narrative voice.


