AUDIOBOOK COVERS USING CANVA

Sharon S. Darrow

Audiobooks are the fastest growing component of the industry, so when you finish publishing your paperback and ebook, don't stop until you've learned how to produce your audiobook and get it done. And remember, if your book is available through Amazon, you can get your audiobook done through ACX. There is a pay-in-advance option, also a shared royalty option that doesn't cost a dime upfront.

One of the challenges of doing your audiobook is that you have to create a new cover. You can't use the same one from your paperback or ebook, because the audiobook cover has to measure 12 inches X 12 inches, or 2400 pixels X 2400 pixels. And you can't cheat and just create a new background around your other cover because ACX won't accept it—in addition the audiobook cover has to feature the narrator's name as well as yours. You can pay a professional, or learn how to use a design program like canva.com to create your own artwork.

Here are the covers I created for my books, both kindle and audiobook, so you can see and compare. And I am obviously not a design expert. I paid professional cover designers to create my first two books, but did the last two because my designer moved out of state and bought an art store. I do own the photographs, though, so that made it easier.

ACX throws a few curves, like no vertical or horizontal lines that extend the whole length of the cover, and no text or vital picture components in the lower right hand corner triangle—they reserve that area of all covers for their promotional material. They do make submitting a cover pretty easy, and let you know if it is not acceptable and what you need to do to fix it.

I'm thrilled to announce that my historical fiction series, *Laura's Dash*, will soon be available in audiobooks. The first one, <u>She Survives</u>, is finished and available through Amazon and Audible. The second one, <u>Strive and Protect</u> will be up within days. Books three and four, <u>Desperate Choices</u> and <u>Her Triumph</u>, will be following shortly.

Let's pretend for a minute, we're an author considering a new **cozy mystery series**. After careful analysis of numerous cozy mysteries, a certain template emerges.

Following this successful template, our story must begin with a **beautiful**, **blonde**, **female**, **sleuth**, about 30 years old, recently divorced with or without, a child. She must have a dog or a cat that doesn't solve crimes, but it helps. Her sweetheart, (who resists a committed relationship) is connected to **an inept police department**, which gives our sleuth access to official information usually withheld from the public. She must have a quirky friend, preferably of another race, gender, or combination there-of.

She also needs an unusual profession or hobby. The **best jobs or hobbies** have already been snagged by multiple other popular mystery series. These include book store owners, catering services, dog groomers, travel agents, writers, pet sitters, private detectives, cruise ship directors, bakeries, college professors, librarians, etc.

For any hope of a successful series, **she'll need a career that hasn't been done to death**, but gives her access to numerous murder victims and lots of suspects. In the end she must succumb to temptation, use terrible judgment to expose the killer, and at the last moment, be rescued by her boyfriend.

So, let's begin, using the cozy mystery template. Let's have our potential sleuth own a septic tank truck giving her access to plenty of overflowing back yards where she is able to spot various, nefarious 'going's-on'.

The lady septic tank pumper-outer and her quirky sidekick **find a body in the pump house**. Proceed to red herrings, misunderstandings, and dubious suspects. Sadly, all have alibis.

Toss in some plumbing trivia, stopped up toilets, (a humorous scene or two involving overflowing bathtubs, or embarrassing bathroom encounters) and move on to the climax where our heroine agrees to meet the local home and garden store plumbing salesman in a remote warehouse, but neglects to tell anyone where she's going. *This is a must-be-included situation*.

The killer/plumbing salesman strings her up to the rafters, because she's 'flushed him out.' Death is imminent. However, her dog (or cat, raccoon or gerbil), tracking her scent, leads her detective boyfriend to the warehouse, just in the nick of time, with a ring in his pocket, having finally realized his true commitment to her.

The **killer is apprehended**, every toilet is unstopped, and the heroine, her sweetheart, and the dog ride off into the sunset in her sewer truck.

Doesn't this sound like a sure-fire red-hot New York best seller cozy mystery? I actually started to write this story and got as far as the lady and the sewer truck. That's when an owl, a mountain lion, and a Native American Spirit Woman high-jacked the novel. But that's another story. ... Elaíne Faber




